3. Current AUBG Projects and Initiatives:

- AUBG Accelerator Fund the AUBG Accelerator intends to pull existing resources and build on previous initiatives focused on promoting innovation and entrepreneurship curriculum and hands-on learning at AUBG, such as the ASPIRE Innovation Hub funded by an ASHA grant. AUBG has a history of successful student start-up companies over the years. AUBG alumni form the backbone of the entrepreneurship ecosystem in the region. AUBG offers regular classes on entrepreneurship topics. The AUBG Accelerator can draw on such resources and expertise in an attempt to create an accelerator program following best practices. Startup accelerators support early-stage, growth-driven companies through education, mentorship, and financing. Research shows that there are four key factors for success of accelerator programs fixed-term support, cohort-based, mentorship-driven, and culminating in a tangible result or "demo day." AUBG together with its donor and alumni base can deliver most of these key elements for the launching of an accelerator program for students' start-up projects.

- Economics Chair Fund The purpose of the fund is to establish a Chair in Economics at the University. The Chair supports a high-performing faculty member in the field of Economics at AUBG. Distributions from the endowed fund are used to support the salary and the benefits of the holder of the Chair, and for non-salary support costs related to his/her research pursuits. The activities of the Chair and the use of the endowed fund is governed by the university and its Board of Trustees.

- **Financial Aid for Students** AUBG makes both financial aid and scholarship support available to attract diverse and highly qualified students and to make an AUBG education affordable for those students. Financial aid is based on the academic merit and the financial need of the student. Financial need is determined through an analysis of the application for financial assistance and supporting documents submitted as part of the application packet.
- **Hardship fund** the University maintains a "hardship fund" to provide some amount of aid to a student in an emergency, usually a one-time grant for one or two semesters and dependent upon available funds.
- Science and Environmental Lab AUBG launched a crowdfunding campaign to raise funds for equipment of the newly opened science lab at the university. The Advanced Student Physics and Environmental Science Lab is extremely important for the launching of the Physics major in the Fall 2019 semester, with a serious potential to attract students. Its main purpose is to provide AUBG students with hands-on experience in different science disciplines, as well as to accommodate observations and important experiments in natural sciences.
